DE REGIONAL AND STATE INITIATIVES

Description of Task(s)

- *Task # 1: CHP Awareness: CHP/DE Regional Initiatives*
 - Goals/Objectives: To coordinate the multiple regional efforts on behalf of implementing the national CHP roadmap's action items and reach the goal of doubling CHP in the US by 2010.
 - Have held regular monthly calls each month with leadership from the regional initiatives. Have invited guest speakers on topics which include: interconnection, EPA's CHP program update, DG market analysis, and state-level DG rulemaking.
 - Have helped organize two face-to-face meetings between the Initiatives and the RACs held in conjunction with the annual CHP roadmapping conference and Policy Day. Helped lead the discussions along with Ted Bronson

Task #1 (continued)

- Attended and represented multiple regional activities in person or by phone at USCHPA Board of Directors meetings as the officially elected Regional CHP Coordinator on the board;
- Have participated in and coordinated reporting with and on behalf of the regional Initiatives at the CHP Team Meetings:
- Am currently participating in the organizing and moderating of a panel for the upcoming May 4th Policy Day conference in DC. The panel will feature a rendition of the “Regional Highlights” from some of the more developed regional efforts.
- Made presentations at other conferences including events in NY, Boston, Washington, Mid-Atlantic, and others

Description of Task(s)

- Task #2: Manufacturing Sector Initiatives
 - Develop a marketing approach and workshop content that speaks to the industrial sector's bottom line.
 - Hold a workshop for a specific sector within the manufacturing industry to facilitate the adoption of CHP technologies.
 - Identify and work with regional and state partners in order to broaden the reach and scope of the workshop to attract manufacturers and their partners from a broad geographic area.

Description of Progress Against Task(s)

- Met with other subcontractors with a manufacturing outreach task to determine what industrial sector had significant potential.
- Contacted RACs and regional energy offices to identify potential partners in a workshop.
- Set up working group to determine content, suggest speakers, design marketing strategy

Description of Progress Against Task(s)

- Developed hold-the-date flyer, agenda, and lined up organizations to invite companies from Northeast and Mid-Atlantic area.
- Held workshop in Syracuse, New York, January 27.
- Strong attendance and interest in workshop, but unable to attract many manufacturers.
- Succeeded in providing valuable information to project developers and other key partners.

Description of Task(2)

- Task #3: Education and Outreach Briefings
 - A previous task on the commercial sector was modified to focus on education and outreach briefings, given interest in various energy issues that continued to focus policy makers on the need for national energy policy changes.
 - The Institute organized three briefings for policy makers and others on CHP and related issues.

Description of Progress Against Task(s)

- The Institute took the lead and worked with other organizations to offer three briefings:
 - Worked with the Clean Energy Group to host a briefing on different methodologies to consider for multi-pollutant legislative proposals that focus on the benefits of an Output-Based Allocation of emission Trading Allowances.
Delayed the rest of the briefings until early 2005 because of anticipated changes in policy-making community.
 - Organized and hosted with EESI a briefing on the potential of CHP to help alleviate tight natural gas markets
 - Organized and hosted with EESI a briefing on the benefits of expanded DE as a key resource in the nation's energy future.
